HYBRID TIMELINE

HYBRID MODEL BASICS

- Students will be divided into three concurrent groups—Full-time Distance, Hybrid A (in-person Mon/Tues), and Hybrid B (in-person Thurs/Fri).
- Students continue in their current class, with their current teacher, regardless of the model they selected.
- Teachers will instruct both groups of students simultaneously, whether the teacher is in school in person or teaching remotely. This may mean that some students in school will receive instruction from a teacher who is remote; these students will be monitored and assisted in person by classroom assistants.
- Both Full-Distance and Hybrid students will interact with each other and their teachers four days each week. Hybrid students will attend school in-person two days each week.
- Special Education services and Tier 3 interventions may be provided in person and/or virtually.

I will take my temperature each morning, and if I am feeling ill, I will alert school administration and stay home from work.

 continue to take place over zoom.
- * Ensure that cleaning supplies are readily available and that our school is disinfected nightly.

- Follow CDC and local health guidance regarding safe operations of our building.

Complete Daily Health Screenings

I will take my child's temperature and fill out a health screener for each child in my family every morning. To make it easier, I can download the Kinsa app for our school!

Follow New Drop-off and Pick-up Procedures

Staggered start times add complexity to school staff's job and are crucial to maintaining school safety. I commit to having my student(s) at their assigned door ready to enter at their assigned time, picking my student up at their assigned time, and not lingering on school property. I will model social distancing at drop off and pick up and not congregate with other parents.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

Family members will not be permitted inside the building during drop-off and pick-up times.

Students and families should remain in their vehicles as they proceed through the drop off line until staff is available to receive them.

The line will wrap around the building to a **screening zone on 17**th **street** where students will be dropped off after passing the health check.

Siblings should **arrive** at the youngest child's arrival time.

Siblings should **depart** at the latest time for their family.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

TECHNOLOGY

Children's House and Lower Elementary students will not need to bring their HCS-issued or personal tech devices to school on most days. The exception is during our testing window for the Forward Assessment (3rd grade only) and STAR assessment (2nd and 3rd grade). These dates will be communicated closer to our testing window.

Use of tech devices for Upper Elementary will be determined by the classroom teacher. HCS issued devices will need to be brought during the testing windows described above.

Adolescent students should bring their HCS issued devices with them each day. If they do not have an HCS issued device, one will be provided for use at school.

TESTING UPDATE

- 3rd thru 8th grade students will take the Forward test this year.
- The sessions will be scheduled during work periods around lesson times as much as possible the weeks of April 26th and May 3rd.
- More info will be emailed as it is available.
- We will talk about Spec Ed considerations at our next meeting.
- The STAR window falls in mid-May

MEDICATION

- Medications will be delivered to the classroom as needed.
